INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE - Mayor Land called the meeting to order and gave the Invocation. He said Monday the 31st is Memorial Day, a day set aside to remember those who died so that our Nation might live, and that we might live in Freedom and Liberty. He asked everyone to reflect on their great sacrifice now and for over 235 years, as he led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Land recognized and welcomed Mrs. Merriweather, and her son who grew up in Apopka and who now plays for the Duval Tigers, Jacksonville, Florida.

ORDINANCE NO. 2170 - SECOND READING & ADOPTION - ZONING CHANGE AND APPROVAL OF PUD MASTER PLAN - Orchid Estates change in zoning from R-1AAA to PUD, and approval of the PUD Master Plan for property located on the west side of Jason Dwelley Parkway and north of Appy Lane. - Mayor Land said Ordinance No. 2170 meets the requirements for adoption, having been duly advertised in The Apopka Chief on May 7, 2010. Mayor Land opened the meeting for a public hearing.

Thomas Thum, a landowner of property adjacent to the subject property, expressed concern over the dumping of solid and liquid waste on the subject property, creating a health hazard. CAO Anderson said he would have staff look into the matter.

With no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Land closed the public hearing.

MOTION was made by Commissioner Arrowsmith and seconded by Commissioner Till, to adopt Ordinance No. 2170, and approve the PUD Master Plan for Orchid Estates. Motion carried unanimously, with Mayor Land and Commissioners Arrowsmith, Dean, McQueen, and Till voting aye.

11. ORDINANCE NO. 2168 - FIRST READING - Amending Chapter 54, "Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions," by creating a new Article VI, entitled "Impoundment of Motor Vehicles Used to Facilitate Certain Crimes." - Mayor Land said Ordinance No 2168 does not meet the requirements for adoption and will be held over for a Second Reading. The City Clerk read the title as follows:

Mayor Land opened the meeting for a public hearing. No one wishing to speak, he closed the public hearing.

MOTION was made by Commissioner McQueen and seconded by Commissioner Arrowsmith, to accept the First Reading of Ordinance No. 2168, and hold it over for a Second Reading. Motion carried unanimously, with Mayor Land and Commissioners Arrowsmith, Dean, McQueen, and Till voting aye.

12, ORDINANCE NO. 2171 - FIRST READING & TRANSMITTAL TO DCA - 2010 Cycle #2 Large Scale Comprehensive Plan Amendment Future Land Use Map Change, including the Wekiva Parkway Interchange Land Use Plan.

MOTION was made by Commissioner McQueen and seconded by Commissioner Till, to remove Ordinance No. 2171 from the table. Motion carried unanimously, with Mayor Land and Commissioners Arrowsmith, Dean, McQueen, and Till voting aye.

Pat Tyjeski, Senior Planner of Land Design Innovations, Inc., presented a presentation on the Wekiva Interchange Land Use Plan. (The PowerPoint presentation is incorporated into and made a part of these minutes).

CAO Anderson and Ms. Tyjeski responded to a number of questions from Commissioner Till in regards to the Wekiva Interchange Land Use Plan document attached to the ordinance.

Commissioner Till expressed concerns that this proposed development could end up competing with the Town Center project, possibly causing one of the developments to fail.

CAO Anderson said there will be some major differences in the two projects, and the distance and development timing will also be a factor. He said both projects will be market driven.

Regarding the Land Use component of the Ordinance, Commissioner Till expressed a concern about the Swanson Land Use Amendment, that under the Commercial land use, another gas station might be developed on that corner of Hwy 441 and Hiawassee Road. Mayor Land responded that the City receives revenues from gas stations for the maintenance of the roadways.

Jay Davoll, Community Development Director, explained that a gas station proposed in a C-1 zoning district would require Special Exception approval.

The City Clerk read the title as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 2172 - FIRST READING - Amending Apopka Code of Ordinances, Chapter 82, by adopting a new Article VI entitled, "Water Conservation Ordinance for Landscape Irrigation." - Mayor Land said Ordinance No. 2172 does not meet the requirements for adoption and will be held over for a Second Reading. The City Clerk read the title as follows:

Mayor Land opened the meeting for a public hearing. No one wishing to speak, he closed the public hearing.

MOTION was made by Commissioner McQueen and seconded by Commissioner Dean, to accept the First Reading of Ordinance No. 2172, and hold it over for a Second Reading. Motion carried unanimously, with Mayor Land and Commissioners Arrowsmith, Dean, McQueen, and Till voting aye.

SITE APPROVALS

1. LAKE DOE COVE, PHASE 5. - Preliminary Development Plan - Property located east of Binion Road and south of the railroad right-of-way - Community Development Director Jay Davoll gave an overview of the project and answered questions of the City Council. (The staff report is incorporated into and made a part of these minutes.)

Mayor Land opened the meeting for a public hearing. No one wishing to speak, he closed the public hearing.

MOTION was made by Commissioner Arrowsmith, and seconded by Commissioner McQueen, to approve the Preliminary Development Plan for Lake Doe Cove, Phase 5, as recommended. Motion carried unanimously with Mayor Land and Commissioners Arrowsmith, Dean, McQueen, and Till voting aye.

DEPARTMENT REPORTS AND BIDS - CAO Anderson said the Administrative Report for the month of April had been distributed and he was available to answer questions of the City Council. No questions were asked.

CAO Anderson announced that Congress was asked to prioritize their requests for funding for this coming year, and our Downtown Overpass Bridge and the Incubator Program that we talk about with IFAS was placed on the list. He said this is good news for Apopka.

CAO Anderson said the Town Center project is progressing well. He said we will be entering the Public Hearing Phase in the next 30-45 days, and an update will be presented to the City Council in the next couple of months following the Public Hearing Phase.

MAYOR'S REPORT - Mayor Land reported the Captain Jack G. Grossenbacher Monument Dedication will take place on May 25th at 10:00 a.m. He invited all to attend the dedication.

Mayor Land sadly reported that Robert Burgust, former Apopka Postmaster, has passed away. He said the funeral services will be held at the First Presbyterian Church at 10:00 a.m., on Saturday, May 22nd. Viewing will be conducted at the Loomis Funeral Home on Friday evening. He expressed his deepest condolences to the family.

Mayor Land said a Citation of Appreciation was received from John Cloran, Chapter Advisor of the Apopka Middle FFA Chapter, for the City's "encouragement, cooperation and assistance given the FFA in helping them to accomplish outstanding achievements in agriculture, leadership, citizenship and community development".

2. **Public** - There was no old business from the public.

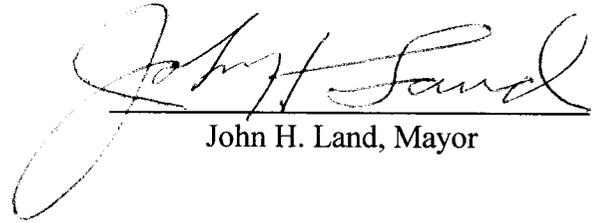
NEW BUSINESS

1. **Council** - Commissioner Till said residents of the Wekiva Glen Subdivision have requested the placement of the Wi-Fi pole(s) be delayed until they have had the opportunity to present their concerns to the City Council at the June 2nd City Council meeting.

CAO Anderson explained that the City has been working with the Wekiva Glen Subdivision Homeowner's Association for the past seven (7) months to work out their issues. He said the homeowners wishing to address the City Council are in conflict with the decisions of the Homeowner's Association. He said in his conversations with the homeowners, he has asked them to submit their recommended locations for the pole(s), and the recommendations will be presented to Motorola. Motorola is performing the engineering of the system and can advise if any of the options are valid for consideration.

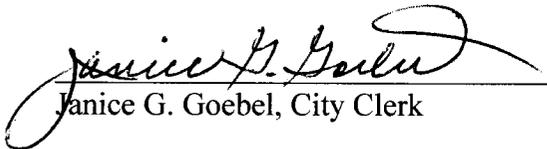
