Minutes of the regular City Council meeting held on June 5, 2013, at 1:30 p.m., in the City of Apopka Council Chambers.

INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE –Mayor Land gave the Invocation. He said it was June 6, 1944, known as D-Day, that the allied forces stormed the Normandy Beach to liberate Europe. He said it was the worst battle of the war and many died that day. He asked everyone to reflect on that event and their sacrifice for our freedom and liberty as he led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Michael Cooper addressed the City Council regarding the need for the City to adopt an ordinance requiring and enforcing commercial businesses to maintain their landscaping. CAO Anderson reported the City is actively enforcing the landscaping maintenance requirements through Code Enforcement.

EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION

1. Kenneth Krouse – Public Services/Water Plants – Five Year Service Award - Mayor Land said Kenneth began working for the City on May 12, 2008, as a Water Plant Operator “B”. He was reclassified to a Water Plant Operator “A” on August 22, 2008, which is his current position. The City Council joined Mayor Land in congratulating Kenneth on his years of service to the City.

2. Jessie Daniels III – Public Services/Sanitation – Twenty Year Service Award - Mayor Land said Jessie was not present and will be presented his service award at a later time.

3. Kevin Kwader – Fire Department/EMS – Twenty Five Year Service Award - Mayor Land said Kevin was not present and will be presented his service award at a later time.

9. Authorize the donation of a canine cage from the Apopka Police Department to the City of Belle Isle for the canine program.
10. The Police Department requests City Council approval for the expenditure of funds from the Federal Law Enforcement Trust Fund, in the amount of \$2,000.00, for investigative buys and undercover operations.
11. Approve the Disbursement Report for the month of May 2013.
12. The Police Department is submitting an application to receive \$16,174.00 in grant funding toward a video enhancement system for use by the Criminal Investigations Division.

Conservation (1 du/20 ac), for property located north of Boch Road, west side of Rainey Road, adjacent to Lake County Line. (Parcel ID No. 05-20-28-0000-00-003)

Beth Jackson, Orange County Environmental Protection, said she was available to address questions of the City Council. None were asked.

The City Clerk read the title as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 2309 - FIRST READING - COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENT - SMALL SCALE - FUTURE LAND USE - Rock Springs Estates, LLC, from "County" Low Density Residential (Max. 4 du/ac) to "City" Residential Low Suburban (Max. 3.5 du/ac), for property located north and south of West Lester Road and east of Vick Road. "Parcel ID Nos. 28-20-28-0000-00-103 & -118)

The City Clerk read the title as follows:

Mayor Land opened the meeting for a public hearing.

Sam Sebaali, Florida Engineering Group, stated he was the representing the owner and was available to answer any questions of the City Council. None were asked.

Carol McCorkle, 357 West Lester Road, said the property surrounding East Lester Road are a part of the Wekiva River Protection Area, and asked that the City Council stay sensitive to the integrated wildlife systems in the area that need to be protected when considering future development.

No one else wishing to speak, he closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Kilsheimer suggested that including some kind of commercial development at the intersection of Lester Road and Vick Road would aid in building communities, and encouraged this consideration during future discussion of development.

Sam Sebaali explained the ordinances presented for adoption are proposed to make the zoning on the properties consistent with the surrounding area properties.

MOTION was made by Commissioner Kilsheimer, and seconded by Commissioner Arrowsmith, to accept the First Reading of Ordinance No. 2309, and hold it over for a Second Reading. Motion carried unanimously with Mayor Land, and Commissioners Arrowsmith, Dean, McQueen, and Kilsheimer voting aye.
